Season's Greetings.....

The Council of the Municipality of Tweed extends heartfelt greetings of the season to all residents and visitors in our municipality.

We are pleased to have successfully managed many capital projects this year through sound financial planning and with financial assistance through funding opportunities.

This year saw the completion of a major construction project on River Street which included water and sewer mains, storm sewers, street surface and sidewalks. Approval for an extension to the project completion date ensured the 2/3 funding from the Federal and Provincial governments.

Many smaller scale projects were completed in the Village and in the rural areas....

Renovations at the municipal building included relocation of the Council Chambers to the former Tweed Library space; a new customer service area including a wheelchair

accessible counter; energy efficient upgrades including the replacement of old windows and the installation of new gas fired boilers for heating.

Rural roads projects included tar and chip on portions of Kenner, Vanderwater and Flinton Roads and prep work on portions of Lynch and Palmateer Roads. A new fountain was installed in the lake at Tweed Memorial Park. Electronic speed signs were installed at three entrances into the Village. New vehicle purchases included a fire rescue vehicle, tractor and mower, and a tandem truck.

Funding Opportunities.....

The municipality pursues many available opportunities for grants and funding.

We were successful in our applications for Federal grant funds for accessible doors, ramps and washrooms at our community halls in Queensborough, Actinolite and Thomasburg and at the Lions Hungerford Hall.



Ice surface lights at the Arena were installed with an approved financial rebate from the Hydro One energy retrofit incentive program.

The TD Friends of the Environment program and Hastings Stewardship funds contributed to the purchase and planting of new trees at the Fairgrounds recreation lands.

Premiere Elvis Festival.....

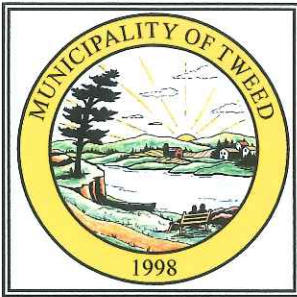
Council was pleased to support the first annual Tweed Tribute to Elvis Festival.

Smoke Free Zones

The air in Tweed will be fresher in 2012. As of January 1st it will be prohibited to smoke within 25m (82 ft) of any playground or playing field and within 9m (29 ft) of any municipally owned doorway. Smoking areas at municipal buildings will be designated.

Look out for non-smoking signs posted around the community.

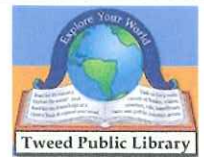

Economic Development

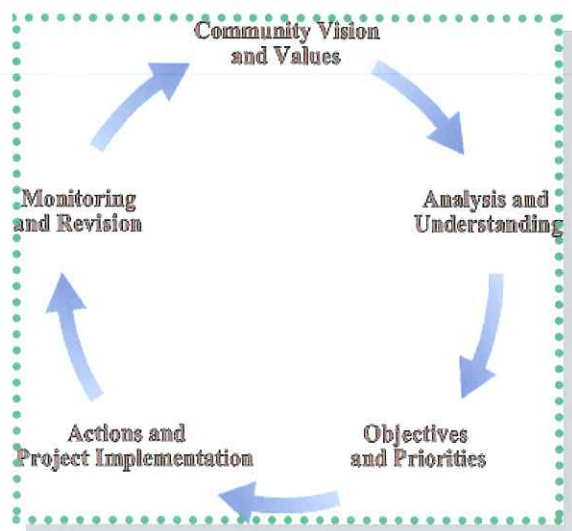
